

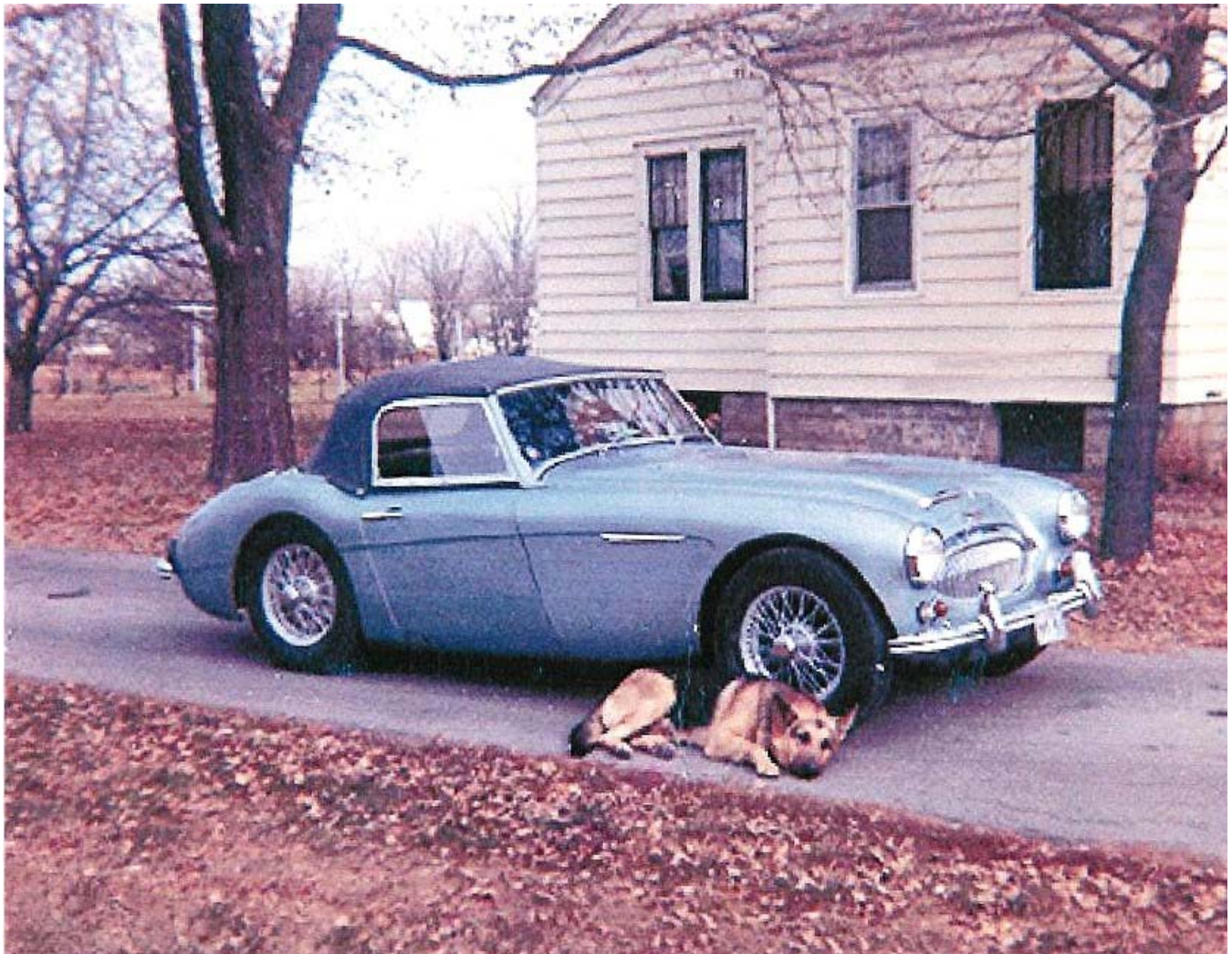

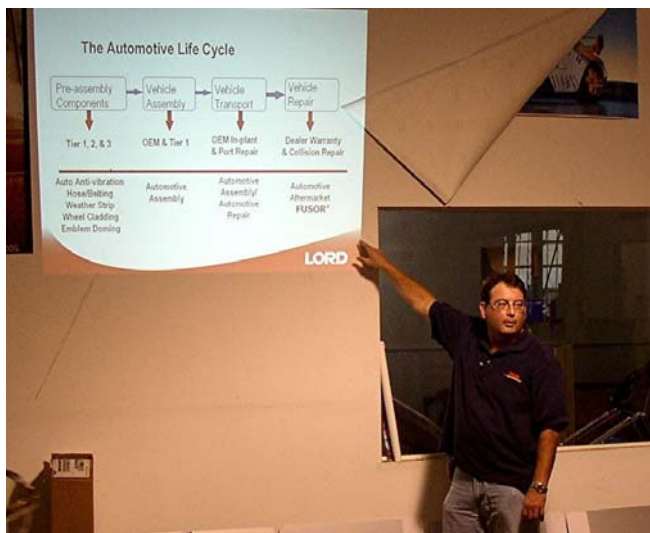

BMC fields a multi-car big Healey rallye team for the first time

Healey 100s had appeared in occasional major European rallyes since the early 50s, most often as individual entries in the hands of privateers. Starting in late 1957, and then in 1958, British Motor Corporation entered a single corporate-owned car, until it decided on a new strategy beginning with the 1958 Alpine Rallye. To celebrate the movement of 100-6 production to Longbridge, it put forth a full corporate effort by fielding a team of five 100-6s, in the hands of experienced teams of drivers, two of which were all women, together with two Bugeye Sprites. In one of the severest tests of both human and machine, the Alpine comprised a distance of nearly 2400 miles, for five days, over some of the most rugged mountains imaginable in both the Alps and the Dolomites.

Below left: Alpine veteran and '56 and '57 European Rallye Ladies Champ Nancy Mitchell (L), with Gillian Wilton-Clark, had the loan of BMC Vice-Chairman George Harrison's personal car for the Rallye. A navigational mistake cost them a coveted Alpine Cup (a penalty free run), but they finished 12th overall and 6th in class.

What travails could await these intrepid participants in this event? In Gott's own words: "We were descending the Cayole and were over the worst of it... Then quite unexpectedly the whole panorama started to revolve around. Chris nearly fell out of the car and immediately blamed me for clouting a bridge... Something suddenly crashed down onto the hardtop, bounced onto the bonnet and bowled off down the road. I thought that perhaps there was an avalanche coming down, but...we realized there was no avalanche, and the big lump that had fallen on the car was the rear wheel....The rear wheel had come off, overtaken us,... bowled its way up the mountainside, and then fallen back onto the road again and hit us. Closer examination revealed that the hub spline had fractured right off."
