As I write this, Doug and I are returning from the SE Classic XX in Boone NC. (Doug is driving.) We had a wonderful time in the High Country of NW North Carolina, and we would like to thank the Carolinas Club for putting on such a great event. The Broyhill Conference Center, located at the highest point on the Campus of Appalachian State University, is a very nice facility with plenty of meeting rooms, great hospitality, reasonable rooms and friendly staff. The event started on Thursday evening and included a full weekend of events with Funkhana, Silent Auction, Arts and Crafts, Gymkhana, Rallye and Popularity Car Show, all followed by a dinner and awards. Doug and I spent some of the day driving in the mountain back roads on Thursday after arriving late on Wed. Doug drove all the way, his first time of driving over a couple of hours at a time.

Rallying as navigator for Jim Werner of BGAHC, we enjoyed the roads off the Blue Ridge Parkway (The Parkway portion was fogged in). The Rallye was a blast for all but one unlucky BJ8 driver who overshot the same corner as a Subaru Wagon who was undershooting the same corner. The front of the BJ8 now had a definite "sneer" on its way to Florida. We thought we were doing very well, but the navigator read two questions as one and could not find the double-word answer after four passes over the area.

Highlight of the car show was the appearance of three very historic cars. The 100S formerly owned by Phil Coombs and the Healey 4000 (Rolls engine), both now owned by Alan Cassavant. Also there was the PA Black over Pink 100M, which was used to introduce the M option at the 1955 Earl's Court Show. It took 1st place for 100s. Next year, the SE Classic will be at Little Switzerland, NC. I certainly plan to attend.

An interview of Jim and Jo Switzer

When did you join the Central Indiana chapter of the Austin Healey Club? We joined in the fall of 1984 and received our 20-year membership in 2004.

How many annual Conclave events have you attended? Cincinnati, Charlotte, Indianapolis and Akron. **Favorite Conclave other than Indianapolis?** Jim: I drove a Healey with Steve Martin to the Charlotte Conclave. The event had great weather and beautiful scenery. We did however run out of gas, but having the luck of a Healey owner, we coasted down a ramp and right up to a gas pump!

Have you held a Club office? Jim: President and Vice President a couple of times, Newsletter Editor, SeptemberFest Chairman and now National Delegate.
