From the Editor

We were saddened to learn of Paul Imel's passing on Saturday evening. The visitation is at the Freeman Funeral Home in Shelbyville Wednesday evening and the funeral is at 11AM on Thursday at the funeral home. Our best wishes go out to Kay Goldsberry and Paul's family.

Well, I punted the tri-carb's brake issue to Strohm Automotive on the southwest side of Indy. While fitting new rear brake shoes did help, I still wasn't happy with the pedal travel (Charlie, I got nothing!). So Jim Frakes put the car in his Austin-Healey trailer on a Sunday afternoon and met me at Strohm's Monday morning. A couple of days later I was driving the car home between the rain drops (taken the hard top off as getting in/out of the Healey in the trailer isn't easy). The issue with the brakes was air in the master cylinder. While both of us used a pressure bleeder, they also pumped the brake pedal which I did not. Of course after driving the car to the Halloween party at Jim and Bev's I noticed that the brake lights weren't working. So I replaced the brake light switch and had to bleed the system again. I did try fitting LED tail light bulbs, but the turn signals wouldn't flash. Apparently not enough current flow to heat up the bi-metallic strip in the flasher. One can buy a gizmo that provides the needed resistance, or a different flasher.

Melanie and I drove the Healey up to the Indiana/Michigan border for Northern Indiana's driving tour last Saturday. Two and half hours each way. Water temperature was pretty reasonable 180 degF on the way up (outside air temperature in the 60s). On the way home at 2500 rpm in 4th overdrive on US 31, it was in the low 70s and the water temperature gauge was reading around 195 which (still) seems high to me. Not sure if that gives much cushion for warmer weather. Got to get my confidence up if we're going to drive to Waco in April for the Texas Healey Roundup. Anyone want to tag along?
