I hope we get good weather, and several members show up in their Healeys for our drive down to Columbus for the tour of ACME Sports and Classic and the Atterbury-Bakalar Air Museum. Skip has put together an interesting day for us.

For folks coming from the north, we'll meet at the Franklin Kroger at 8:30 and drive down together to Donut Central in Columbus. People from the south can meet us there at 9:30. ACME is only a couple blocks away after getting our coffee and sugar rush. Ben Zwissler, the owner of ACME is going to do some demonstrations for us.

After finishing at the shop, we'll take a short drive-up Central Avenue to the airport and our tour of the Atterbury-Bakalar Air Museum where we'll also have a delivered lunch and meeting.

Bring cash for lunch. We'll take it up and order ahead of time.

We want to get club Healey pictures at the Museum for our club business cards.

Registration for Southeastern Classic is now open. October 31-Nov 3. There are only a small number of rooms available, so if you're going, register soon at triadhealey.org.

Did anyone read the Healey Quarterly online magazine? I didn't know the 3000s had a factory optional 'Coolaire' air conditioning available. Has anyone ever seen one that has it?

I got to meet our newest club member recently. Jerry Baker is restoring a bugeye that he raced in SCCA in the late '60s to put it back on the street. He's got a lot of bodywork needed between racing accidents and modifications, but he's got the talent, background, and the shop to do it. He's made a couple trips to my garage for measurements to see where he needs to 'tweak' his car.

Jerry has an extensive background in building cars, including working for Shelby, a Can-Am racing team, and building and restoring open wheel racecars. I enjoyed spending time with him – he has a lot of good stories!

The club is planning on a trip to his shop in June so others can check it out.



Jerry said it's a good thing he likes doing puzzles!

The #36 door in the background was taken off the Sprite when he was racing it in the '60s.

Brandon's Sprite continues to be a work in progress (sometimes the progress is in reverse). While waiting for Jo Curto to rebuild the carbs, we swapped distributors with a Pertronix unit I had left from my original motor. We got the carbs back and installed and found the accelerator and choke cables were too frayed to re-install. We ordered a new choke cable and found that a bicycle brake cable will work for the accelerator for a LOT less money. It even came with enough cable to possibly make two accelerator cables. Thanks Bob, for loaning us a cable cutter that doesn't cause fraying.

With the new cables installed, we decided to fire it up – and found that we had no spark. We pulled the Pertronix and went back to the original distributor. After getting a VERY weak spark, a new coil, points, condenser, and rotor were installed. Cranking it over with a little help from shots of carb cleaner, it fired up and ran smooth. It was idling a little high, but we couldn't tell how high since the tach doesn't work. He decided to take the car out to see how It ran. He drove it around the block – a new record distance since owning the car! No bonnet, no windshield, no license, no worries!

We swapped garages so I could get started on working on my car. He pulled his car into the driveway and let it idle while I did a quick cleanup of the garage floor. When he tried to drive the car up to the front garage, it died and refused to restart. The adjustment screw wasn't tightened enough, and the distributor decided to adjust itself while it idled!

I'm still trying to get disk brakes on my car. I picked up a set of front suspension/brakes from the Frakes auction hoping I could use most of those parts. It turns out, the only pieces I've been able to use are the brake hose brackets, hubs, and the steering arms. Every other piece has had to be replaced. The A-arms looked usable, and I had them blasted and powder coated. There was more pitting on them than I liked, but I tried to use them. When putting in the kingpins, I found one of the A-arms pinched the kingpin/gaskets, making it unusable. Putting the kingpin on the other A-arm, I found the threads were messed up so the fulcrum pin's plug wouldn't go in. I tried putting the suspension together on the bench and found that the spindles wouldn't go onto the kingpins! I called Jeff Porada at Winner's Circle where I got the spindles and asked him what I was doing wrong. He didn't see anything obvious, but said he had his car's suspension apart and I could come down so we could figure it out.

At Jeff's shop, he tried fitting my spindle/kingpin together, then tried several times using some of the pieces from his car before coming up with the solution. After setting the endplay on the hub bearings, you must loosen the bearings to mount the spindle on the kingpin. It's something he'd never run into the problem because he'd never tried to mount the spindles with the hub bearings torqued down. (Something that isn't mentioned in the manuals or any of the YouTube videos I watched.)

Mounting the A-arms on the Sprite was a learning experience. The driver's side took me over 4 hours, not including several breaks as I needed to walk away for a while. The passenger side only took 20 minutes.

If I had a better mechanic, the brakes would probably be finished.
